## Library Services and Technology Act

### County Library Grant Projects

#### **Libris Design Building Program Database Training** – Wicomico County Library

- To train public library staff statewide in the use of *Libris Design* so that they can create building programs and project cost estimates for new and existing buildings

#### **The Lounge** – Wicomico County Library

- To create a “teen space” in the Central Library and to provide special resources, services and programs to all of the teens in the County

#### **Lower Shore Library Consortium** – Dorchester County Public Library

- To allow the Library to migrate to a new integrated library systems (ILS) by joining the Lower Shore Consortium (LSC) on the Eastern Shore

#### **Mobile Reference** – Frederick County Public Library

- To provide mobile reference service within the C. Burr Artz Library by purchasing and configuring six mobile computers to allow access to online resources at the point of need

#### **Poetry’s Here@Your Maryland Public Library** – Talbot County Free Library

- To expand the Poetry in the Branches program (designed to develop and implement public poetry programs) to other public libraries in the state

#### **Project LEAP: Science is Fun!** – Harford County Public Library

- To establish a creative environment where guest scientists will help children participate in a think-tank experience and in hands-on science projects through monthly programs based on the Maryland Voluntary School Curriculum

#### **Storyville** – Baltimore County Public Library

- To provide initial staffing to the Storyville Project which will be a durable and whimsical, child-sized, print-rich interactive learning center for children, parents and caregivers within the Rosedale Library

#### **Teens Connect** – Carroll County Public Library

- To train teens in the use of e-learning technologies to share information about their lives and culture with teen counterparts in Paide, Estonia (a sister city to Westminster), through a partnership with the Carroll County Public Schools and McDaniel College
